### **COVID-19 RESPONSE FUND**

As lockdown measures went into place in March 2020, it was immediately apparent that an entirely new set of needs – on an unprecedented scale – would hit our community. And United Way responded. We quickly teamed up with our colleagues at Community Foundation of Henderson County and opened the Henderson County COVID-19 Response Fund.

The Fund was established to rapidly deploy resources to community-based organizations addressing both the health and economic effects of the pandemic. Our community responded generously, donating over \$439,000 to meet these urgent needs. The Fund was closed in September, after making grants to 41 local nonprofits to provide food, rent and utility assistance, medical services, child care, senior and legal services, mental health and domestic violence support, and PPE and technology to allow for continuation of essential services.


United Way is proud to have shown up when our community

For our Day of Action 2020, United Way and Henderson County Public Schools (HCPS) teamed up to organize a fundraiser so that all 13,000 HCPS students could receive a Back to School hygiene kit containing hand sanitizer, masks and helpful handouts about how students and their families could stay safe while at home or at school.

Over 100 volunteers assembled kits in their homes, workplaces and in socially-distant gatherings. Funding for the project came through individual donations, civic club and corporate gifts, grant funding from Pisgah Health Foundation and event sponsorship from Pardee UNC Health Care.

Gaia Herbs donated the hand sanitizer and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) provided 30,000 adult-sized masks for middle and high school students. Smaller, adjustable-sized masks were purchased through the donations.

Gaia Herbs delivered big impact for our Day of Action. They donated 13,500 bottles of hand sanitizer, and their employees assembled 5,000 kits. This generous gift made them a gold level campaign sponsor. In addition to donating the hand sanitizer, Gaia Herbs held three separate volunteer days for employees to help assemble the back to school health and safety kits at its Mills River and Brevard locations.

# DAYS OF CARING 2021







We successfully turned our 2021 Days of Caring into a community initiative to raise food and funds for 13 local food pantries in Henderson County. Together, we raised over \$54,000, collected over 3,100 pounds of food and assembled 1,500 Kids' Snack Packs.

Henderson County food pantries have seen a 50% increase in residents needing food assistance in the last year due to the pandemic. UWHC funded partner MANNA FoodBank reports that many of these families are seeking help for the first time, and since the start of the pandemic, one in five adults and one in four children struggle with food insecurity in Henderson County. All thirteen pantries that benefitted from this initiative are MANNA partner pantries.

# **EDUCATION**

We all want to live in a community where students get a great education that prepares them for college, careers, and a good life. United Way is committed to providing opportunities to help all children succeed, regardless of the obstacles they face.



**Blue Ridge Literacy Council** adapted their Family Literacy program to an online format during the pandemic to allow Spanish speaking mothers to continue engaging their young children in early literacy activities, while both mothers and toddlers gained English language skills.

Staff sent books and activity kits to participants' homes to keep them engaged in learning over Zoom.

**The Boys and Girls Club of Henderson County** has always enjoyed a robust partnership with our local schools. That strong partnership served Club members in a critical way during virtual instruction this past year. Like many of his peers, Nathan struggled deeply with the transition to virtual learning. Feeling isolated from his

friends, overwhelmed by the changes, and unprepared for the increase in independent work, Nathan saw his grades suffer. Due to a close partnership between the Club and Nathan's school, Club staff were quickly alerted to the situation. With a couple of frank conversations and an improvement plan in place, Nathan re-engaged. Knowing that Club leaders were holding him accountable and that he



wasn't in it all alone was a huge motivator. Nathan pulled F's and D's up, and ended the first quarter with a 3.0 average. This dynamic partnership and focus on student accountability allowed the Club to support members who struggled during COVID-era learning.

# RESPOND

### INCOME



#### **Pisgah Legal Services**

has a long history of serving vulnerable clients to prevent unlawful evictions in Henderson County.

Last summer, the Warren family was renting a property with horrible conditions, including raw sewage in the yard. They wanted to move, but Mr. Warren

had lost his job due to COVID, and finding housing they could afford proved challenging. When Mrs. Warren complained to the landlord about the needed repairs, the couple was served with an eviction notice and seven days to leave the property.

Pisgah Legal Services Attorney Casey Steen represented the Warrens and succeeded in getting the eviction dismissed and the landlord's false claims in damages thrown out. This reprieve gave the Warrens the time they needed to find a more suitable home, without being threatened with homelessness.

#### We know that many in our community are facing economic challenges and struggling to support themselves and their families.

United Way believes that when we help our neighbors gain the skills they need to improve their income, pay down debt and manage their money, we build a better Henderson County for everyone.



**Thrive** has been able to expand their housing services for homeless residents during the pandemic.

One of the biggest challenges Thrive faces is finding affordable housing units for their clients due to the housing shortage in our area.

# RECOVER

### HEALTH

We all have a stake in creating a healthier community, one where our neighbors lead long, active lives, avoid risky behaviors and enjoy good nutrition and physical activity.



Despite the incredible stress the pandemic has placed on childcare centers, two new centers joined

**Smart Start's** GoNAPSACC program this year, committing to improving the nutrition and physical activity elements at their centers

Jodie Williams was recognized as the Go NAPSACC Teacher of the Year this year! Despite pandemic restrictions, mentors with **Big Brothers Big Sisters** have found ways to support and spend time with their "Littles" this past year. And many of these Littles need support now more than ever before.

Katie is a 14 year old Little Sister being raised by her father. Katie's mother has been incarcerated since Katie was five years old for drug charges and child neglect. Katie had reportedly been engaging in risky behaviors such as self-harm, sexual activity, and sneaking out of the home. Katie and her Big Sister now meet regularly to go on fun, safe outings. The two of them engage in activities that Katie has not experienced before. Katie has discovered that she really enjoys drawing and cooking. Katie has stopped harming herself and has refrained from sneaking out of the house. She has also improved her grades and attendance at school.

Katie and her Big Sister continue to grow in their friendship, and with the mentorship of her Big Sister, Katie is avoiding risky behaviors and exploring activities that make her come alive.

# REIMAGINE

### **BASIC NEEDS & CRISIS SERVICES**



#### The Council on Aging for Henderson County has

always prioritized nutrition for homebound seniors in our community as a critical need. But more seniors were homebound than ever before this past year, due to COVID.

Even though most Meals on Wheels volunteers had to pause their involvement, the Council on

Aging found a way to continue and even expand service during the pandemic by switching to weekly deliveries of frozen meals.

One of the over 500 Henderson County Meals on Wheels recipients this year was Miss Jean. Miss Jean lives in an area that is in one of the more isolated locations that Meals on Wheels serves. Her home is at the end of a half-mile dirt road. She is mostly confined to her chair all day long but is always cheerful when her meals are delivered.

This past Christmas, the MOW volunteer brought a holiday shoebox along with the usual delivery of nutritious meals for the week. Miss Jean was overwhelmed - she couldn't believe she was getting a wrapped gift. "For me?" she said. Her daughter later called to say it made her mother's day to receive that simple gift.

# REBUILD



United Way believes that by providing food, medical assistance and crisis services to Henderson County residents in need, we are helping people take control of their lives and create a better tomorrow for themselves and their families.



**The Free Clinics** has remained open throughout the pandemic, providing health care for the most vulnerable in our community even during this time of crisis. They adapted to the pandemic with a shift to telehealth for most patient visits and curbside pickup for pharmacy patients.

### **RISING LEADERS**



Rising Leaders is a seven-month long program, designed to develop the next generation of community leaders and board members for Henderson County nonprofit organizations. A global pandemic did not stop us from holding the 10th annual program!

Participants attended monthly information sessions on Zoom and learned from local professionals about a variety of topics including nonprofit life cycles, fundraising, marketing, and financial responsibilities. New this year was a session on diversity, equity and inclusion in non-profit organizations.

Thanks to generous sponsorships by WNC Bridge Foundation and Carolina Village, Rising Leaders is free of charge for all participants. 
### NC 211

#### NC 211 Experienced Record Call Volume During the Pandemic

2.1.1 North Carolina

211 is United Way's information and referral helpline to connect callers with essential health and human services. The service is free, accessible 24/7, completely confidential, and available in

many languages. When the pandemic began in March 2020, Governor Cooper instructed NC residents to turn to 2-1-1 for COVID-19 related resources and information, and 2-1-1 continues to be a source of ongoing recovery information - especially for food, housing and financial assistance with utilities and bills.



"Brent lost his job due to the pandemic and had fallen behind on all of his bills, including his rent. Brent called NC 211 for the first time after his landlord told him he was going to have to evict him for being months past due on his rent. When he called NC 211, he was hoping the Call Specialist would be able to provide him with a referral for rent assistance. While a referral to help pay his rent was the first step, the NC 211 Call Specialist went one step further. The Call Specialist made sure that Brent was aware of a national moratorium on evictions and went on to explain to Brent the simple steps he could take to protect himself from eviction. The Specialist walked Brent through the process while they were on the phone, and told him where on <u>nc211.org</u> he could find the form he needed to file for this eviction protection. By the time he hung up the phone, Brent felt tremendous relief. He had a plan now for financial assistance and eviction protection until he could get back on his feet financially later in the year."



#### Girls EMpowered (GEM):

GEM is an after-school program for girls, designed to increase self-esteem and school success. During the fall of 2020, Women United members continued to support GEM girls with letters and self-care kits while they were learning remotely. And by Spring of 2021, all three schools where GEM is offered were up and running with virtual programs. Guest speakers used Google Meet and Zoom to connect with the GEM girls. Women United members provided each of the 26 fifth grade GEM graduates at Upward and Hillandale Elementary Schools with a backpack filled with school supplies for the next school year. In addition, Women United supported 10 young women at Hendersonville Middle School, who were able to complete their GEM experience with a long-awaited dream board session and celebration.






